# **Chairman's Report**

There was no Chairman's report presented in April as the Chairman was away on annual leave.

### Jetpatching

The Motorcycle Council of NSW has raised concerns about a road repair process known as JetPatching, which is becoming a popular with councils and other road authorities.

Jetpatching is a 4 stage process using a combination of compressed air, spray on asphalt emulsion and gravel.

The MCC of NSW has observed this method of road repair being used in violation of the Australian Asphalt Pavement Association's guidelines for loose stones remaining after the repair is completed.

The MCC has been working with the NRMA and has recommended to the RTA that the practice of JetPatching be discontinued until:

1 - Signs are displayed to warn motorcyclists of the hazard.
2 - The procedure of using JetPatching is modified so the

process doesn't result in an excessive number of loose stones.
