TRANSPORT MASTER PLAN I(Janelle)

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The Government's strategy is to consult with ALL interested parties over the next 9 months, producing discussion papers, calling for public submissions, preparing a draft transport master plan and then the final Transport Master Plan in November 2012. Consultations will initially be with advisory groups made up of those who attended the announcement, extending to a call for public submissions in February next year. Regional forums are to commence early next year and will cover the state.

We had the opportunity for some initial input at this meeting. Everyone was asked to write down their 3 priority areas for transport planning and then individual round-table discussion were held at each of the 10 or so tables in the room. Between CJ and I we raised issues such as driver awareness training, encouraging the use of motorcycles as a 'green' alternative.

We also had a chance to provide suggestions on how best consultation can take place. Our input included: not having all meetings during public service work hours; allowing oral submissions to save us poor volunteers from working 24/7 writing submissions, ensuring extensive consultation beyond the boundaries of major regional centres.

The first advisory group meetings are due to be held on **14-15 December**. We won't know until the invitations arrive what form these consultations will take or whether they will be focused on particular issues or very broad. Once we know these things what we will need is **YOUR INPUT**. We will send out an email asking for your views so we can make sure our input to the Transport Master Plan is from our members not just from those attending the meetings.
