Amended Brake Test for motorcycles

Many people are not aware that changing the brakes on your bike is a modification that requires certification by an engineer. Centre for Road Safety recently had a look at writing a policy that would make this process simpler in conjunction with a number of stakeholders including the MCC.

A couple of draft versions had been floating around for quite some time based upon a document pout together by Ian Davis. This document was reviewed by Guy Stanford, Brian Wood and Christopher Burns and out comments submitted.

Following a couple of meetings it was announced recently that the testing procedure posed some issues with wet testing and they would use DIRD Circular 33-2-1 as the testing procedure.

VSI60, Motows on the rear of vehicles and Light Vehicle Suspension Manual

VSI60 was gazetted on the 9th December, Gazette Number 111,and announced by the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, the Honourable Duncan Gay;

I'm delighted to announce I've approved for gazettal two new light vehicle standards.

The first is titled the Light Vehicle Modifications Manual - Suspension an

Whilst this mostly effects dirt bike riders it is still a win for riders as previously these units were deemed illegal or at best a "Grey Area". Now thanks to the assistance of Dan Leavy, Manager Safer Vehicles Centre for Road Safety and the input from the MCC through Christopher Burns the policy on this has been clarified.

The Light vehicle suspension manual also had a great deal of input from the MCC with Christopher Burns representing the MCC of NSW and the NSW and ACT Four Wheel Drive Association along with Geoff Northcott. This is the culmination of over 2 years work and once again clarifies policy on suspension modifications for Light Vehicles.

Road Safety Advisory Council

The Road Safety Advisory Council held it's regularly scheduled meeting and NSW Police announced their will be 2 unmarked police bikes on the roads in 2017 along with an unmarked "utility" vehicle.

Harold Scruby tried to push through a change that would see Point 2 Point speed cameras turned on for light vehicles but the general attitude was against this proposal. The views of the MCC delegates, a resounding NO, have been forwarded to the RSAC group.

NSW Crash Stat's

NSW road fatalities have increased 30% over last years with 40 more people dead.

The increases are;

- Drivers 181, up 30 deaths on 2015 (25% increase)
- Passengers 51, down 8
- Motorcyclists 65 no change
- Pedestrians 70, 12 more than last year (21% increase)
- Pedal cyclists 5 down 2 on last year.

Needless to say the authorities are pulling out all stops to try and reduce the upward trend, you have been warned.

Transport for NSW Launches the #See you Soon Campaign

Transport for NSW's #SeeYouSoon holiday road safety campaign that uses Twitter-linked digital billboards and the social media voices of everyday people to encourage loved ones to drive safe these summer holidays.

Using the hashtag #SeeYouSoon, messages from the public will be displayed across a network of digital billboards, on social media, online and in-stations across the state for drivers and commuters to see on their journey.

This year alone, 375 lives have been lost on the states roads, 39 more than the same period last year – mothers, fathers, friends and loved ones who never made it home for Christmas.

The #SeeYouSoon campaign will focus on something just as impactful as those numbers - the emotional connection between holiday travellers, their friends and families.

The innovative approach will remind people not to be complacent before setting off and to celebrate every safe journey this summer.

NSW Centre for Road Safety Executive Director Bernard Carlon said;

".. too many lives have been lost on NSW roads this year and reminded everyone that they should never underestimate their ability to change people's behaviours.

"Whether it's a gentle reminder as loved ones are headed out the door or a more personal message to a friend or family member on Twitter – these messages can be a powerful reminder to those on our roads and can even save someone's life,"

"That's why we're calling on everyone to tweet their #SeeYouSoon messages to be displayed for their loved ones as well as all drivers across NSW."

"Summer holidays should be a happy time, but the road toll during this busy period is a reminder of the importance of us all coming together to make every journey a safe one."

The campaign was launched on Monday 19 December by road safety ambassadors including The Wiggles, Australian cricketer Peter Nevill, Jarred Tyson of the Western Sydney Wanderers and players from the Sydney Swans and the Greater Western Sydney Giants.

The #SeeYouSoon campaign forms part of NSW Government's commitment to bringing the road toll closer Towards Zero.

Those wishing to participate are being encouraged to tweet a message to their loved ones at home or before they get in the car using the hashtag #SeeYouSoon, as a promise and reminder to drive safely.


So, what's your message to friends and family on the road this holiday season?

Someone recently dug up a copy of MRA ACT's Newsletter, The Inside Line from 1986 and CJ graced the cover demonstrating a riding position at the ACT Roads and Transport Instructors course that was arranged to assist with the implementation of Pre Permit Learner rider training way back when. Many people are not aware how long Christopher Burns has been involved in Motorcycle advocacy, seems it has been over 30 years.



Issues of note from the two copies, April and July 1986 include;

Compulsory Third Party Insurance, protests had given the MRA an opportunity to consult with government on CTP pricing being based on corrupt data, an issue that still plagues us even now. CTP discounts were offered to riders that completed an approved rider training course

An article on the upcoming Motorcycle Awareness Month written by Dennis Hogan, a report on the Australian Motorcycle Council by Dave Shellshear AMC Chair (Acting) ride reports and a report on the Roads and Traffic Learner Pre-Permit course and some other items of interest including a comment in there from a pre-ride briefing by then MRA President, Annaliese Caston;


